
SHORT TERM COURSE IN AGARBATHI MAKING

Department of commerce conducted a short term course in Agarbathi making on 28th November 2019. The programme was inaugurated by Dr. N S Vincent Joy, Principal, Christian College Kattakada. Christumol Rethnam, Art and craft trainer handled the training. Students were given practice in agarbathi production and were also given inputs into the economic benefit of this small scale business. Sri. Aby RL, Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce explained the marketing and commercial side of agarbathi business.









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1. MISSION AND VISION OF ASAP

Government of Kerala has initiated an ambitious Programme, the Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP) with the objective of tackling the issue of growing unemployment in the state. The programmes aim at equipping selected school/college students with skills in Communication, IT and selected areas of industry and service sectors. ASAP is a joint initiative of State, General Education and Higher Education Department. The initiative was started in 2011. The programme aims at equipping selected school/college students with skills in communication, IT and selected areas of industry and service sectors. The outcome will be that ASAP certificate holders are more employable. ASAP is envisaged as part of a preventive strategy under State Skill Development project, to address the existing unemployment issue in the State of Kerala.

2. OBJECTIVES OF ASAP

The specific objectives of the ASAP are as follows;

- a. To enhance the employability of the students graduating from regular academic courses by introducing additional skill acquisition programmes along with the regular studies.
- b. To ensure students enrolled for ASAP programmes attain a reasonable level of competence in English Communication as well as in basic IT domain.
- c. To provide good quality industry endorsed training in selected industry sectors to the interested students predominantly from the families belonging to socially and economically weaker sections.

ASAP envisages development of skill programmes in three levels, that is, from certificate programmes to dual degree programmes. The programmes will adhere to National Vocational Education Qualifications Framework (NVEQF). The starting point will be at level three or four of NVEQF.

3. ASAP IMPLEMENTATION

Foundation (Soft Skills + IT Skills) and Industry Skill Courses are offered alongside to the regular educational curriculum.

WHO CAN JOIN: First year degree Arts and Science students or first year Higher Secondary students from Govt. / Aided institutions that run ASAP courses.

HOW CAN YOU APPLY: Applications can be submitted to the ASAP Coordinator of the concerned institution.

WHEN CAN YOU APPLY: Orientation and selection at the parent Institutions of the student, where ASAP programme is offered (July – August)

SELECTION PROCEDURES:

- Application form should be submitted within 7 days after the registrations open. Institutions will update the students on the process.
- One to one Interview process
- Computerized Aptitude test
- The first 30 students who have scored the highest will be enrolled to ASAP.

At Level 1 ASAP imparts 300 hours of skill training to selected first year students. Of this, 180 hours will be a foundation module comprising of Communication Skills and IT skills and the remaining 120 hours will be the module related to the skill sector chosen by the student.

Components of the Programme

The major components of the programme are

- Foundation Module
- Skill Course
- Internship

The Foundation module programme mainly contain a 180 hours of programme where the students get exposed with English speaking skill and basic skill of Computer. Skill

Development Executives (SDE's) will conduct the foundation classes at the respective institutions itself. One-hour class is conducted during the weekdays either before or after the school/college working hours. The focus of the foundation course is to develop soft skills that are essential to work efficiently in a corporate environment. By imparting Communication Skills in English and Basic IT courses to a large student community, the project envisages to create a large talent pool that can work in modern day organizations that promote a global work environment. The other 120-150 hours are devoted to the skill sector chosen by the student for specialization. These courses will be conducted in Skill Development Centres (SDC's). A hub and spoke model is followed for conducting skill courses. All the partnering institutions are being attached to a nodal centre called Skill Development Centre (SDC) managed by a Program Manager. There are 93 skill courses. Depending upon the infrastructure and geography, every Skill Development Centre will run specific skill courses; a student can opt from those specific skill courses that further enable them to be employable and industry ready. Skill training will be conducted in various SDC's over the state. A district may have more than one SDC. The skill training for various skill courses will be taught by industry appointed trainers and these skill courses will be conducted in Sundays and other public holidays. By choice, student groups receive sector specific skills. The Programmes are developed, delivered, assessed and certified with the active participation of the related industries to ensure labour market acceptance of the programmes. Refreshments are provided by ASAP for the students during the foundation module classes at the respective institutions.

Specialities of ASAP classes

ASAP foundation classes have been designed specially to equip the students to be a good social human being having all well behaved social skills and to able to understand their abilities and weaknesses so as to have personal skills sharpening at the foundation level training.

At the initial stage of class room training skill development executives are giving the students the special employability oriented skill sets.

They are given activity oriented sessions to focus their individual skills and to have themselves positive attitude to boost the confidence to face the audience in a large.

Major skill focused in the foundation module is

- Personal skills
- Social skills
- Organisational skill
- Professional skills

Foundation module also comprises of 80 hours of IT module where in which the basic computer knowledge along with job oriented IT modules are provided to the students. College students are specially focused on concentration on a 50 hours project preparation and presentation.

ASAP BATCHES

1. ASAP BATCH 2015 -16

As the initial stage of ASAP in 2015 we have proudly given an opportunity to induct the ASAP course curriculum into the daily academics of college. As we are very much happy observing the tremendous growth of this skill development mission in Kerala.

We knew that ASAP could inculcate some values and better ability to communicate and we hope that this course will definitely bring light into the employability and showcase the extracurricular talents within each students. Dr. Smitha Pavianose, Assistant Professor of Economics has served as the faculty coordinator of ASAP. Coordinator has attended the meeting of Principal and Coordinator of Aided College of ASAP, at Trans Towers, Vazhuthacaud, Thiruvananthapuram on 5th January 2015.

As the initial year of skill development mission we had **21** students from across various departments. The interview was conducted on 6th November 2015. The students were selected on the basis of socio- economic conditions and mostly from BPL category. Government specifically focuses on the very weaker sections of population rather than privileged and most abundantly resourced. The inaugural function of ASAP was conducted on 15th December 2015.

ASAP classes mainly focus on the activity oriented sessions and interactive platforms where each student is given special opportunity to showcase their talent individually and in a group. The students were enrolled into Skill Course namely **Domestic Data Entry Operator** from IT skill sector.

Students actively participated in various programmes and conducted and celebrated main events such as world environment day, fresher's day etc.





2. ASAP BATCH 2016-17

ASAP was one of the successful courses which were presently running in the college. Many of the students of previous students had got opportunity to present themselves in front of the various audiences for different purposes, which created an urge and push to join in the course. ASAP Orientation programme for first year students were conducted on 25th July 2016. The interview process was completed on 3rd October 2016.

Present batch had **25** students and they were enrolled into skill course namely **Certificate Course in Meeting Conference and Event Planner** from hospitality sector was the core programme given to the students.

As special events this year's students were asked to present a project presentation and with the help of the skill development executive and program manager they were able to successfully complete the project in a timely and well professional manner. ASAP

Coordinator has participated in the 2 days Residential Professional Development Programme, 'IGNITE', under ASAP, Higher Education Department, Govt of Kerala at Maria Rani Centre, Thiruvananthapuram from 11-11-2016 to 12-11-2016. Coordinator also attended ASAP Coordinators meeting cum training on July 8th 2016 at Govt.HSS Kulathummel Kattakada for the successful implementation of this programme.

3. ASAP 2017-18

Classes officially commenced from December 2017 and as usual foundation course which is communication English and basic IT skills were trained at the initial stage. The students were enrolled into Skill Course namely **Certificate Course in Team Leader.** Students were very much enthusiastic about the program and actively involved in the core course.

National Level Workshop on "Skill Development"

Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP) Christian College, Kattakada in association with Department of Economics organised a one day National Level

Workshop on "Skill Development" on August 10, 2017. The focus of the workshop was to create self confidence and to improve the soft skills and language skills among the participants. 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
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Report on self-defense training for women students 2018


